A way of blessing

Great Moulton way-station

This way station shelter is part of the Via Beata project, which aims to set up a complete trail of artworks from Lowestoft in the East to St. David's in the West. The trail is using existing footpaths and rights-of-way to enable walkers of all ages to pilgrimage across the U.K. and meditate upon the Gospel of Jesus Christ. This carved panel by Steve Eggleton represents a parable that Jesus told about two builders. One builds on a foundation of rock, the other on sand. When storms arise, the house built on sand collapses. Jesus concludes that the person who hears what He says and puts it into practice is like a builder who builds on a foundation of rock. When difficulties arise, that person is not shaken. (See Matthew 7 v 24-27)



The **Via Beata** was launched in the Summer of 2009.

It is on course to become a complete trail of Christian artworks stretching across the UK from East to West at its widest point.

Artworks which communicate the Christian Gospel are being commissioned and set up in situations where people can stop and meditate upon them.
