Letterston to Llanhowel - miles

Overview

Starting from the campsite, the path goes through a pretty valley then onto the road. Because the footpaths were blocked and impossible to get through, the route then takes mostly small roads to Llanhowell.

Route

From the campsite (intothesticks.co.uk), rejoin the footpath, and cross the railway line with care with kissing gates on either side. Across meadows to footbridge over stream. Further footbridge, then up steps to top. Turn left, past Ty newydd-grug then continue on track to road. Turn right. At farm, turn left through metal gate to left of house at Bryngwyn Farm on bridleway. (This section is not way marked by local council so we couldn't way mark either). Follow line of telegraph poles with hedge on right. Through opening in hedge at top. There is barbed wire in the hedge, but it is possible to get through. Continue with poles and hedge on right to tracked. Go straight ahead and follow track to Priskilly-faw.

Go ahead on road to Castell-ffroga. At t-junction, turn left. keep on road for two miles to crossroads, turn right and continue west and cross B4330 - just south of Newton Cross. Walk 1/2 mile to Newton West then south west to Lower and Upper Tancredston. Continue west to Llandeloy (1 1/2 miles). Then onto crossroads, turn left and continue on road for 3 miles to Llanhowel.

There is no way station here. This tiny historic church is usually open and well worth a visit.
