After Jesus' death and burial he came back to life again. He joined two of his grieving disciples as they walked from Jerusalem to the village of Emmaus. They failed to recognise him and continued their gloomy conversation. Jesus explained to them the significance of his death and how it fitted perfectly with all that they knew from the Scriptures. When they arrived at their destination Jesus joined them for supper. It was as he broke the bread that they recognised him. They immediately rushed back to Jerusalem to tell the other disciples that they had met the risen Jesus.
